


U.S. Lags Behind Other Wealthy Nations in Infant Mortality

A 2014 National Vital Statistics Report <u>published by the CDC and U.S. Department of Health and Human Services</u> revealed that the **U.S. has the 26th worst infant mortality rate of the 29 countries studied**. The U.S. infant mortality rate was **more than twice** that of Japan and Finland, the two countries with the lowest infant mortality rates.

U.S. Highest in Infant Mortality and Highest in Vaccine Doses

Another independent study based on the <u>CIA's 2009 World Factbook</u> paints a similar picture. This time, the data was also compared with each country's vaccine schedule. The startling results: The U.S. had both the highest infant mortality rate and the highest number of doses on the infant vaccine schedule.
